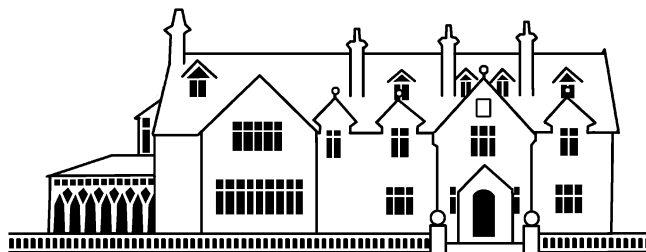

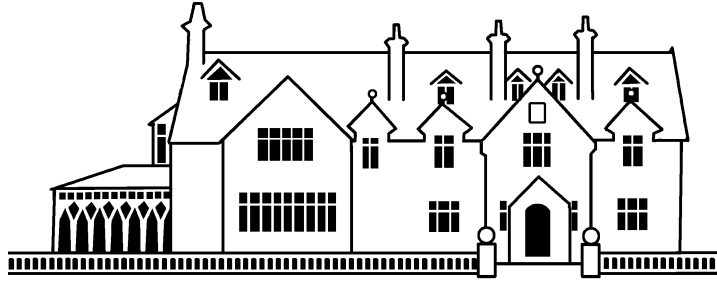

- WM1 (3) LOLO ALBARINO. 2015 £24.75**
Rias Baixas Spain 12.5% Vol.
The Albariño grapes for Lolo come from young vines in the Val do Salnés sub-region of Rías Baixas. Cool-fermented it shows notes of green apple and lemon peel with a hint of stone-fruit, such as white-fleshed plum. The palate is fresh, with zippy fruit and a balancing bitter note on the finish
- WM2 (C) VILLA DE TREFIANO CARMIGNANO DOCG. 2012 £51.00**
Carmignano Tuscany Italy 14% Vol.
The Villa was built by the architect Buontalenti during the 15th Century for the Rucellai family, at the time secretary to the Medicis, and is in classic Renaissance style. The unfinished Villa was purchased in the 1920s by the Contini Bonacossi family owners of Capezzana. The Villa is surrounded by five hectares of vineyards which are located in the Carmignano DOCG in Tuscany. A modern blend of 80% Sangiovese, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Canaiolo. Ruby red with violet hues, this wine has perfumes of cherry and cassis with herbal notes and spice. Structured yet elegant, a wine of great finesse, the Trefiano is opulent with soft supple tannins and a delicious ripe fruit character on the finish.
- WM3 (B) SEDELLA MEDITERRANEAN MOUNTAIN WINE. 2012 £36.25**
Sedella Southern Spain 13.5% Vol.
Sedella is the personal project of Spanish winemaker Lauren Rosillo, who established his 'mountain wine' winery in 2006. The winery is located in Sedella, a small town with only 400 inhabitants, located at an altitude of 750 metres in the Sierras de Málaga appellation. Deep blue with violet hues. Sedella has a developing nose of liquorice, dried plums and herbs that gives way to medium bodied fruit on the palate with fine, smooth tannins, crisp acidity and a lovely, lingering finish.

(No sweet wine surpasses Yquem. It is amazingly rich and opulent with a razor sharp focus. A very good vintage). | £295.00 |

(Famous Muscat dessert wine. Vanilla pod, mixed peel, spiced oranges, cloves, raisins, thick and gloopy but with a whistlingly fresh finish from the acidity that keeps magnificent balance. The orange character is really pure on the palate, like tangerine slices – tangy and freshly-peeled. Drink 2009-19). | £305.00 |

(From the Vega Sicilia stable, this is great value, full bodied, still fresh and youthful but with complexity and length). | £85.00 |

(This full, thick Amarone offers masses of ripe fruit and fresh herbs, with velvety tannins. Turns to black pepper and fruit on the finish. Should age beautifully, but why wait? Drink now). | £85.00 |
| 260 | ANTONIO VALLANA. GATTINARA 2006 (Italy)
(Gattinara is a small commune in the Piedmont area of north west Italy. Produced from 100% Nebbiolo like its more famous neighbours Barolo and Barbaresco, this is far better value for money at this level. Notes of truffle, roses and spice characterise this full-bodied, powerful wine that would be a perfect match for slightly more delicate red meat dishes such as fillet steak or lamb). | £40.00 |
| 258 | CLOS-VOUGEOT GRAND CRU A.C. Domaine Rene Engel 2004
(Full purple in colour and has that extra degree of concentration on the nose. A superb, seamless, fruit-forward, ultra-long wine which has an intensity of very ripe cherries dominating the palate. A wine that is very easy to fall in love with). | £735.00 |

1. CHATEAU D'ARGADENS A.C. Bordeaux Superior, 2014 £24.75
(Purchased in 2002 by Sichels, this property is situated in the Entre-Deux-Mers. The excellent terroir produces robust and soft fruited wines with concentration and balance D'Argadens is one of the best Bordeaux Superieur around. Seen priced at £39.00 in a North Wales hotel). (Also available in half bottles see Bin 159).
2. VALPOLICELLA CORTE GIARA BY ALLEGRINI DOC. Veneto Northern Italy, 2017 £24.75
(This wine is produced near Verona and Lake Garda. It is one of Italy's most popular wines. From the grapes Rondinella, Corvina and Molinara, it has a nose of ripe cherries with hints of spice and a balanced elegance of soft red fruits, acidity and soft tannin and above all drinkability. Allegrini Valpolicella is also available in halves - see Bin 170).
3. HECULA BODEGAS CASTANO Monastrel Yecla Spain, 2015 £24.75
(An impressive concentration with a peppery nose and an attractive dark liquorice fruit. Aged for six months in American oak casks to give soft, polished tannins which balance the spiced, plummy, redcurrant fruit).
4. THE STUMP JUMP, d'Arenberg McLaren Vale Australia 2013 £24.75
(A Southern Rhone mix of Grenache, Shiraz & Mourvèdre from Chester Osbourne, chief wine maker. This is a full-bodied juicy wine with hints of cigar box on the nose, well balanced cooked fruits on the palate and a satisfying finish).
5. ALAMOS MALBEC, MENDOZA Argentina 2017 £24.75
(From the eastern slopes of the mountains of Mendoza. Hand harvested and selected grapes make this fruity, soft balanced red with rich fruit character. Malbec is the name of the grape variety originally from Bordeaux where it is called Cot. It is now an unimportant variety there. The conditions in Argentina are more suitable and it is the third most planted variety).

White

6. WOLF RIESLING, Pfalz, Wachenheim Germany 2016 £24.75
(Ernst Loosen has been making wine from this estate since 1996 when he purchased it. With its low yielding old vines in a prime setting he has produced a wine in true Pfalz style, lime, grass and straw on the nose and a full rich palate of citrus fruits with a crisp finish).
7. ALAMOS CHARDONNAY MENDOZA, Argentina 2016 £24.75
(From the revered Catena family, this Chardonnay is from grapes grown on the low mountains of the Andes. Light oak ageing has given some vanilla nuances in the tropical and citrus fruit aromas. Lots of fruit flavours and a crisp finish).
8. YEALANDS ESTATE SINGLE VINEYARD, SAUVIGNON BLANC, New Zealand 2017 £24.75
(Harsh growing conditions and low yielding vines produce wines with intense varietal character. Intense mineral and fresh herb aroma, balanced by a tropical fruit character and a lingering finish).
9. LAROCHE VIOGNIER, Beziers, Southern France, 2016 £24.75
(Originating from the Northern Rhone the Viognier grape is flourishing here in the South of France. A spicy floral and peachy nose, rich and ripe palate with hints of Apricots and a touch of spice with a rich mouth feel).
10. CANTINA DI MONTEFORTE SOAVE SUPERIORE, Veneto Italy 2017 £24.75
(A fresh, scented nose that shows hints of white fruit and the characteristic almond blossom notes of top quality Soave. Honeyed, waxy and complex on the palate with a lovely citrus twist on the finish).

11. BELLE COMBE AC. Cave Terraventoux 2015 £24.75
(Grenache and Syrah from the slopes of Mount Ventoux in the Southern Rhone. The wine has some lovely raspberry and strawberry notes on the nose with a harmonious well balanced thirst quenching fruity palate).

LOIRE

For the lover of white wine and seafood, this is the best source of supply for good, crisp, attractive wines. Despite their coming from vineyards situated along 600 miles of France's longest river, the Loire, the wines have a remarkable likeness.

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| 12. | MUSCADET DE SEVRE-ET-MAINE SUR LIE A.C., Chateau du Coing de St. Fiacre 2015
(Crisp, dry white wine from the mouth of the Loire. Bottled straight off its lees, (sur lie) it is delicious with all kinds of seafood). | £25.75 |
| 12a | DOMAINE FL CHAMBORCEAU SAVENNIERES 2008
(Chenin Blanc from an exciting new estate with grapes from some of the most prized sites. Nearly all organic. Meticulous wine making results in a wine of exceptional quality). | £35.00 |
| 13. | SANCERRE A.C., André Dezat et Fils 2016
(This comes from a small grower and is one of the best Sancerres we have tasted. It is dry and fruity with a wonderfully delicate bouquet and great length)

| 14. | DOMAINE THIBAUT, POUILLY FUME A.C. André Dezat 2016
(Made from the Sauvignon grape variety, dry with good length of grassy fruit)

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| 15. | SANCERRE A.C. Pinot Noir, André Dezat 2016
(Elegant, light red wine produced from the traditional Burgundy grape – Pinot noir). | £31.75 |
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ALSACE

Today Alsace is actually part of France and lies along the banks of the Rhine. Wonderful white wines are produced here from vines planted on the sheltered lower slopes of the Vosges mountains. In style they are more akin to French wine than German, being dry and distinctive in flavour, although in German shaped bottles. Alsace wines are named after the grape variety from which they have been made.

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| 16. | GEWÜRZTRAMINER A.C., Bruno Sorg 2015
(Lively, spicy Gewürztraminer nose. Soft, full and well balanced fruit, with lychee and tropical fruit flavours). | £32.00 |
| 17. | PINOT GRIS A.C., Dopff & Irion 2016
(Ripe, juicy white with honeyed fruit, good weight and an attractive streak of fresh lemony acidity. Alsace Pinot Gris is very different to that produced elsewhere, having more weight and flavour). | £29.50 |

WHITE BORDEAUX

This area is best known for its magnificent, rich white dessert wines of Sauternes and Barsac. These seem to be regaining a well-deserved popularity for they make the perfect accompaniment to desserts and even to some rich, blue-veined cheeses such as Stilton. This section is also well worth the attention of lovers of dry white wine – those listed below are full of fruit, light, fragrant and crisp.

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| 20. | CHATEAU TOUR DE MIRAMBEAU, A.C. Bordeaux 2016
(Deliciously light, crisp and fruity white Bordeaux. This area is now making excellent white wines). | £28.50 |
| 21. | CHATEAU DOISY-DAENE GRAND VIN SEC, A.C. Bordeaux, Duboudieu 2014
(Very well made wine, mainly from Sémillon and Sauvignon. Lots of fruity flavour. Dry with lovely length). | £39.50 |
| 23. | CHATEAU DE LA CHARTREUSE, A.C. Sauternes 2006
(Rich, luscious dessert wine with excellent fruit and length). | <i>(½ bottle)</i> £33.00 |
| 24. | CHATEAU RIEUSSEC, A.C. 1er cru Sauternes 1995 and 2015
(A worthy neighbour of the famous Château d'Yquem. Classic, rich wine with excellent botrytis character). | £60.00 |
| 25. | CHATEAU DELMOND A.C. Sauternes, 2015
(Semillon, Sauvignon and Muscadelle are used in this clean scented wine with aromatic complexity on the nose and rich clean yet balanced flavours on the palate that last and last). | £38.00 |

CLARET VINTAGES

- 2012** Plenty of attractive short and medium term wines with some ready for drinking already.
- 2011** Fresh well balanced wines of good quality for the mid term.
- 2010** A great vintage, the wines having concentrated fruit and complexity together with the tannic structure needed for long life.
- 2009** An outstanding year without extremes of weather, now being spoken of as one of the very best. Approachable early, yet with the density and structure to last.
- 2008** A tricky vintage, initially dismissed by many but the right bank in particular has come on well. Some very good mid-term wines were made, overlooked in the hype of 2009s on the horizon.
- 2007** The red wines are very mixed. Pomerol and St. Julien are the most consistent appellations Pauillac is very good with one or two exceptions.
- 2006** Good structure, fruit and balance endow these wines with the ability to age well. In their youth they are a full flavoured and quite masculine in style.
- 2005** A truly fantastic vintage with great quality across the board on both the left and right bank.
- 2004** A very good and underrated vintage, delicious fruit and balance. Good for short and medium term drinking.
- 2002** Saved by a dry sunny September. Some good wines. Ready to drink now.
- 2001** September rain and cool weather affected ripening. Some good wines ready to drink now.

RED BORDEAUX

The most prestigious wine producing area in the world. Bordeaux lies in southwestern France. The generic name of claret, given to the red wines of this area, is derived from the French word "clairet". To the connoisseur, each of the areas within the Gironde produces wines of distinct character – the St. Emilions have great flavour and bouquet and are fuller and softer than the Médocs. Pomerol wines are similar but distinct, while the full, soft, elegant Graves have much finesse and mature reasonably early.

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| 30. | CHATEAU CISSAC A.C. Haut Medoc 2012
(Textbook Médoc with plenty of juicy, chunky blackcurrant fruit, firm tannins and fine length. Cissac's new style has good balance, and is no longer overwhelmed by the tannin levels of pre-2000 vintages). | <i>Per bottle</i>

| 31. | CHATEAU FEYTIT-CLINET A.C. Pomerol 2012
(This small property is run by J P Moueix of Petrus fame. It enjoys the advantages of their organisation especially as far as the vineyard and winemaking are concerned The wine is plummy fruit on the nose with a more elegant flavour than expected with good length and a firm finish). | £60.00 |
| 32. | CHATEAU ORMES DE PEZ A.C. Saint Estephe 2002
(Deeply coloured, with a slightly herbal, stony nose revealing red currant, spice box, and damp earth characteristics, medium-bodied and cleanly made. Ready to drink now). | £45.00 |

RED BORDEAUX (cont')

- 32a. CHATEAU LA TOUR DE BY, A.C. Médoc 2009 £39.00
(There cannot be many Châteaux as consistently good as La-Tour-de-By: impeccably made claret, ripe and substantial with judicious oak and balanced tannin).
- 32b. CHATEAU SOCIANDO-MALLET A.C. Haut Medoc 2008, £55.00
(The full-bodied 2008 offers abundant notes of plums, blueberries and black raspberries interwoven with hints of white flowers, damp earth and background oak. This impressively endowed, muscular effort will benefit from 2-4 years of cellaring).
- 32c. CHATEAU PIPEAU, A.C. Grand cru Saint-Emilion 2012 £45.00
(A delicious upfront fragrant wine with ripe fruit, liquorice, bayleaf, oak characteristics, from a well regarded modern property Also available in halves. See Bin 163).
33. CHATEAU BATAILLEY A.C., Grand Cru Classé Pauillac 2008 £55.00
(Named after a `bataille' that was fought here between the French and English (who else) 600 years ago, Batailley has once again lived up to its reputation of offering good value, early drinking, quintessential Pauillac. Made from 73% Cabernet Sauvignon, 23% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Franc and 1% Petit Verdot, its toasty, ripe plum and cedar nose leads on to a palate with vivid cassis and raspberry fruit, creamy vanilla oak and a lovely long finish).
- 33a. CHATEAU GRUAUD-LAROSE, A.C. 2me cru Saint-Julien 2001 £125.00
(Powerful bulky style, with plenty of cassis, spicy new oak and roasted herbs on the jammy fruit nose. Husky, muscular wine with chunky tannins and good ageing potential. Ready to drink now).
34. CHATEAU LAFON ROCHET A.C. St. Estephe 2004 £70.00
(Spicy fruit with some toasty oak and smoky mineral elements. A supple start on the palate with gentle to moderate weight and a nice texture. A good fleshy spicy fruit finish).
35. CHATEAU D'ANGLUDET, A.C. Margaux 2012 £75.00
(This is the Sichel family's own property with the wine made by Ben, the youngest of the brothers. It is a delightful Margaux, with pretty cassis and violet fruit and good balance, plus soft tannins and good length).
- 37a. CHATEAU PALMER, A.C. 3me cru Margaux 2005 £550.00
(An impressive dark ruby colour, black fruit, floral truffle and cigar box scents on the nose with excellent ripeness and richness on the palate. Robert Parker 97 points).
38. VIEUX-CHATEAU-CERTAN, AC Pomerol 2006 £225.00
(Alexandre Thienpont does a fine job here. This wine is deep and complex with hints of spice, black berries and liquorice).

WHITE BURGUNDY

Produced over a wide area from just south of Paris to below Dijon in central France, white Burgundies possess a luscious, rich, buttery quality that makes them unique. The Chardonnay grape, grown here, gives superb bouquet, fruit and length in that it can be the most perfectly balanced of all white wines.

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| 39. | MACON CHARDONNAY A.C., Cuvée J. Talmard 2016
(Fine, elegant white Mâcon with delicious fruit and balance). | £28.00 |
| 40. | RULLY 1ER CRU A.C. David Moret 2015
(Impressively rich style. Pale golden in appearance. The nose is full with a varying bouquet of flavours; elderberry, lemon, white peach and hints of flint. The palate strikes the characteristically Burgundian balance between acidity and richness, with bright fruit, nuts, oatmeal and notes of honey, a rounded palate and a long finish). | £39.75 |
| 41. | CHABLIS 1ER CRU Les Forets, Moreau-Naudet et Fils, 2015
(A superb, intense Chablis, this has a lovely balance of lemony crispness and full, nutty richness. Forets is a part of Montmains 1er cru and is a relatively new wine for Stephane Moreau, a young grower forging a good reputation). | £39.75 |
| 42. | CHABLIS GRAND CRU Bougros Jean Marc Brocard 2011
A delicate bouquet with hints of citrus fruits and a whiff of smokiness, the palate is intense with delicious mouthfilling fruit of apples and pears with a touch of saltiness on the finish). | £58.00 |
| 43. | ST-VERAN A.C., Jean Claude Boisset 2015
(Top class wine maker in an area which is providing some of today's best value white Burgundies). | £28.75 |
| 45. | CHASSAGNE-MONTRACHET A.C. Chateau de Santenay 2013
(White gold in the glass. A powerful expressive nose, it opens with aromas of ripe pear, white peach and vanilla. The mouth is fresh and full, with lots of minerality. A fine, elegant structure leads to good length on a lovely palate of fresh fruit, honeysuckle and a delicate toast). | £60.00 |
| 45a. | MEURSAULT Les Clous A.C., Jean Claude Boisset 2013
(A very fine, elegant Meursault with ripe butteriness and a faint, subtle oak influence). | £58.25 |
| 45b. | CORTON-CHARLEMAGNE GRAND CRU, Rollin Pere et Fils 2009
(Rich and gently oaky. Length, opulence and class from the specialist in Corton-Charlemagne). | £135.00 |

BEAUJOLAIS

With remarkable ease, the wine makers of Beaujolais can coax the Gamay grape into producing delicious fruit-filled wines that are the envy of the world.

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| 46. | CHATEAU CHASSANTOUR, A.C. Beaujolais- Villages La Lantignié, M. Perroud 2015
(v) (Produced from the Gamay grape, this is a fine example of Beaujolais. Light, flowery and delicious with distinctive style). | <i>Per bottle</i>

| 47. | FLEURIE A.C., Domaine André Cologne 2015
(Fruity, well-made wine. One of the cru wines of the Beaujolais district and probably the best known). (Also available in half bottles see Bin 165). | £32.00 |

RED BURGUNDY

Burgundy too produces some of the world's finest red wines. Lying to the south of Paris, the region is a lush one with its vineyards situated in beautiful rolling countryside. The Pinot Noir grape variety is capable of producing a cherry red wine that is unsurpassed in its delicious flavour and lingering aftertaste.

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| 48. | CHOREY LES BEAUNE LES BEAUMONTS A.C., Jean-Claude Boisset 2014
(Full of nice, chunky black fruits as well as red, it is quite rich and spicy, with very subtle oak notes as Nicolas used large 600 litre casks so as to moderate the oak's influence on the wine). | £40.50 |
| 49. | GIVRY 1ER CRU CLOS JUS, Gérard Mouton 2014
(Gérard Mouton's Clos Jus has such delicious, sappy Pinot Noir fruit that it makes it an undoubted favourite amongst good value Burgundies. Monsieur Mouton is a good source in the quaintly named hamlet of Poncey!). | £42.00 |
| 50. | GEVREY-CHAMBERTIN A.C. Domaine Drouhin-Laroze 2013
(Drouhin-Laroze has one of the best vineyard holdings of any Gevrey estate enabling it to draw from 7 or so sites to make this impressively balanced and complex wine. It has plenty of black fruit and good spiciness on the finish). | £72.50 |

MADEIRA

The Region of Madeira includes the islands of Madeira and Porto Santo both with different characteristics; the former forested and temperate, the latter is hot, dry and bare. The soil is by nature, volcanic, and the vineyards are in terraced steps named "poios" which extend down to the sea's edge. The discovery of Madeira wine happened when the unsold wine aboard in vessels sailing from Madeira to the West, was shipped back to Funchal to be returned to its owners. It was then noticed that quality improved, and as such it was sold as "Round Trip Wine" and it was worth its weight in gold. This voyage of many days of warm weather gave in effect a gentle ageing to the wine. Madeira nowadays is fortified with Portugese grape brandy to 20% alcohol, usually leaving some residual sugar in the wine. Shortly after fermentation is complete the wine is heated to approximately 115 degrees and held for six months. It is then alternately heated and cooled for six-month intervals while slowly maturing in oak barrels. Barrels are generally large and old so as to not impart any oak flavour or tannin and to promote gradual oxidation. Made from red and white grapes, the wines are light to dark brown in colour due to cask oxidation.

PORT

According to an old saying in the Port trade, every wine would be a Port, if it could. Certainly these sweet, fortified wines demand centre stage whenever they appear. Rich, saccharine, intensely-flavoured and, at their best, wonderfully majestic and harmonious, they are wines to be savoured on their own, or with a fine chunk of cheese after a meal.

Port comes from the Douro region of Portugal, about 50 miles east of Oporto, specifically the regions of the Cima Corgo, Baixo Corgo and Douro Superior. The Cima (Higher) is the heart of the Port-producing region, centred around the town of Pinhão, and is the source of most high quality Ports. The vineyards are steep, the granite and schist soil inhospitable, and the temperature very hot. Mechanisation is tricky to say the least. The landscape, with the Douro River at its heart, is stunning.

The British have played a vital part in Port's history, which continues to this day. Port started life as a full-bodied, dry red wine, known in 17th century London as 'blackstrap'. Brandy was often added to the wine by British merchants to ensure it arrived in good condition. In 1678, however, two English wine merchants visiting the Douro region found the "sweetish and extremely smooth" wines of the Abbot of Lamego, with whom they were staying, better than any others they had tasted. The Abbot admitted adding brandy to the wine during (rather than after) fermentation, and the two Englishmen bought all of his stock and shipped it home.

At the same time several now-famous companies were being established in the region: what was to become Warre was set up by Englishman John Clark in 1670, Croft was founded in 1678, Quarles Harris in 1680 and Taylor's in 1692.

SHERRY

Sherry comes from the southern tip of Spain, around the town of Jerez de la Frontera. It was already popular during the time of Shakespeare, as the port of Cadiz, close to Jerez, was the frontier between the Christian and Moslem regions of the time. Sherry is made from three main grape varieties; Palomino Fino, the greatest part of the production, Pedro Ximenez and Moscatel. Sherry comes from two basic styles, Fino and Oloroso.

Fino produces the styles: Fino, Manzanilla, Amontillado and Pale Cream. Its characteristics come from the growth of a film of yeast called Flor formed on the top of the sherry in the cask. The earlier the sherry is bottled after the Flor dies or is removed, the drier and paler the sherry.

Oloroso produces the styles: Oloroso Dry/Sweet, and Cream Sherry. It is produced by stopping the Flor growing, with the fortification of the wine up to 18% volume. This makes a dark golden or amber coloured wine with a lot more body than the Fino sheries.

MANZANILLA

This is a Fino sherry, which comes from the town of Sanlucar de Barrameda on the Atlantic coast. Here the Flor grows all year. The temperature, climate of the area, imparts a delicate aroma with a salty tang.

FINO

The Fino sherry comes from Jerez, where the Flor is at its best in spring and autumn, due to the more continental climate of the area. It produces a pale straw-coloured sherry that is light and very dry, delicate and refreshing.

OLOROSO DRY

The flor cannot grow on this style due to the fortification to 18% volume. This allows contact with the air, producing a dark golden coloured sherry that is elegant with a softer and mellower flavour than the Amontillado style.

AMONTILLADO

Amontillados are Fino sherries with a thinner layer of flor, that lives for 2-3 years then falls to the bottom of the cask. The wine then ages and the contact with the air produces an amber coloured sherry that has a dry and nutty flavour.

CREAM SHERRY

PEDRO XIMENEZ

This grape variety is picked, placed on absorbent sheets and covered in tented polythene sheets. This reduces the water content in the grapes and increases the sugar concentration. It is then vinified in a similar way to the other Oloroso sherries, producing an extremely sweet, dark and syrupy wine which is not very often found on the British market.
